

What ID can I use to vote?

ID must have your name and photo. It can be expired. Acceptable forms of photo IDs include:

- Nebraska driver's license/state ID
- · U.S. passport, military ID, tribal ID
- Hospital, assisted-living facility or nursing home record
- Nebraska political subdivision ID (state, county, city, school, etc.)
- Nebraska college or university ID

What will NOT be accepted?

- · Birth certificate
- Medicare/Medicaid card
- Out-of-state driver's license
- Out-of-state college ID
- · Social Security card
- · Store membership card
- Utility bill/bank statement
- Voter registration acknowledgement card

When does voter ID take effect?

The first Nebraska election requiring voter ID will be the statewide primary in 2024:

May 14, 2024

All elections in Nebraska after that will require voter ID.

In 2022, Nebraska voters approved a constitutional amendment requiring voter ID. In June 2023, the governor signed into law LB514, the bill putting voter ID into effect.

What if I forget my ID?

You will fill out a provisional ballot. For your ballot to count, you will need to present an acceptable form of photo ID to your county election office on or before the Tuesday after the election.

How do I vote with voter ID?

IN PERSON

Present an acceptable form of photo ID or vote provisionally.



EARLY IN OFFICE

Present an acceptable form of photo ID or vote provisionally.



EARLY BY MAIL

Write driver's license/state ID number on early voting application or enclose a copy of acceptable form of photo ID or reasonable impediment certification with application.



BY-MAIL PRECINCTS OR **BY-MAIL SPECIAL ELECTIONS**

Write driver's license/state ID number on ballot return envelope or enclose a copy of acceptable form of photo ID or reasonable impediment certification in ballot return envelope.

What if I can't afford an ID?

You can get a free state ID from the DMV. If you were born in Nebraska and need your birth certificate to get a free state ID, you can get a free certified copy of your birth certificate from the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services. A birth certificate is not an acceptable form of photo ID.

What if I can't get an ID?

If you have a reasonable impediment, you can complete a certification instead of presenting a photo ID. Reasonable impediments are:

- Inability to obtain a valid ID due to:
 - Disability or illness
 - · Lack of birth certificate or other required documents
- · Religious objection to being photographed

REFERENDUM ORDERED BY PETITION OF THE PEOPLE

Referendum Measure 435

A vote to "<u>RETAIN</u>" will keep in effect Section 1 of Legislative Bill 1402 enacted in 2024 by the Nebraska Legislature. Section 1 of Legislative Bill 1402 provides for \$10 million annually to fund education scholarships to pay all or part of the cost to educate eligible students attending nongovernmental, privately operated elementary and secondary schools in Nebraska.

A vote to "<u>REPEAL</u>" will eliminate the funding and scholarship provisions in Section 1 of Legislative Bill 1402.

Section 1 of Legislative Bill 1402, enacted by the Nebraska Legislature in 2024, provides for \$10 million annually to fund education scholarships to pay all or part of the cost to educate eligible students attending nongovernmental, privately operated elementary and secondary schools in Nebraska

Initiative Measure 436

A vote "FOR" will enact a statute which: (1) provides eligible employees the right to earn paid sick time for personal or family health needs; (2) entitles employees of employers with fewer than 20 employees to accrue and use up to 40 hours of such time annually and those employees to accrue and use up to 56 hours of such time annually; (3) specifies conditions regarding paid sick time; (4) prohibits retaliation against employees for exercising such rights; (5) adopts documentation requirements; and (6) establishes enforcement powers and a civil cause of action for violations.

A vote "AGAINST" means such a statute will not be enacted

Initiative Measure 439

A vote "FOR" will amend the Nebraska Constitution to provide that all persons shall have a fundamental right to abortion until fetal viability, or when needed to protect the life or health of the pregnant patient, without interference from the state or its political subdivisions. Fetal viability is defined as the point in pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the patient's treating health care practitioner, there is a significant likelihood of the fetus' sustained survival outside the uterus without the application of extraordinary medical measures.

A vote "AGAINST" will not amend the Nebraska Constitution in such manner.

Shall the Nebraska Constitution be amended to include a new section which provides: "All persons shall have a fundamental right to abortion until fetal viability, or when needed to protect the life or health of the pregnant patient, without interference from the state or its political subdivisions. Fetal viability means the point in pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the patient's treating health care practitioner, there is a significant likelihood of the fetus' sustained survival outside the uterus without the application of extraordinary medical measures."

October 18th 6:00 PM

- Last day Voter Registrations can be completed ONLINE or at the DMV
- Mail in Voter Registrations MUST BE POSTMARKED on this day
- Last day Voter Registration forms to be delivered to the Election Office by someone other than the person registering

October 25th 6:00 PM

• Last day for IN PERSON voter registration to be completed and turned into the Clerk's Office

November 4th

• Last day for in-person early voting in office

November 5th – ELECTION DAY
